GARDENING TIPS: Algae in the Pond? The 60% Solution.

Years ago, when I was asked to teach a course on water gardening and pond installation, I refused to do it until James and I had actually installed a pond ourselves and gained experience in water gardening. Twelve years ago, during the infamous Eden Fire summer of '98, we put in our water garden and it has been a source of much gratification, **and not much work**, ever since. Alga in the pond is a fact of life but we have found that it's best to allow the pond to **find its own balance** with minimal interference from us.

The KEY TO CLEAR WATER is to have plenty of submerged plants (oxygenators), good surface coverage, and relatively few fish.

These are the rules for a balanced pond:

1. Six hours of sunshine will ensure adequate growth and bloom of most water plants.
2. 60-70% of the water surface should be covered with floating plants. This will provide sufficient shading to the water to curtail algae growth. Algal blooms usually occur in early spring when the plants haven't grown enough to provide the required shading.
3. Add 1 bunch (6 stems) of oxygenator cuttings per 2 ft² of water surface.
4. Add 2 scavengers (frogs, snails, toads, tadpoles) per 5ft² of surface area.
5. Add 1 x 6inch goldfish per 100 gallons of water volume (more will result in excessive production of nitrates that will result in more algae.)

When your pond produces algae (and it will):

A. DO NOT DRAIN THE WATER AND REFILL! Fresh water brings a fresh influx of nutrients and is only a temporary solution.

B. DO NOT RELY ON POND PRODUCTS to clear the water. They're expensive and, in most cases, not necessary. Barley straw and Barley Straw extract are very useful however to reduce on the incidence of algae. I've found that it works best if you add the straw (stuffed into a black crate or pillow case) in the autumn so that it has time to start decomposing to work properly in the spring.

C. DON'T ADD TOO MANY FISH and don't over-feed the ones you have. The main reason for having fish in the pond, other than the joy of watching them, is to provide mosquito control. If you over-feed them, they won't need to eat the mosquito larvae.

By the way, other great ways to keep the mosquito population to a minimum is to empty any containers that collect water after sprinkling or rainfall and use a biological larvacide product that contains Bt.I (Bacillus thuringiensis ssp. Israelensis). Not only does this work well in ponds (contained to your property with no outflow) and water features, it's effective for up to 30 days in any standing water such as in eaves troughs and bird baths and poses no risk for animals or birds.

'Kills mosquitoes before they're old enough to bite'.

Gerbera 'Garvinea' series

This is a new series of garden gerberas that has been bred for bloom performance and disease/insect resistance. They're also hardy to about -5°C (not hardy enough to grow them as a perennial here unfortunately) but they bloom from early summer through fall. With fourteen colours in the series, this is a marvelous addition to the annual garden or in containers, flowering profusely over many months and providing long-lasting cut-flowers as well.



Tomato 'Tami G'

Grape tomatoes have taken the garden scene by storm and one of the best tasting varieties is Tami G. Tami G is a staking variety that ripens in 62 days and produces heavy yields of 1 - 1¼ inch, half oz. fruit that grow in clusters of 10 to 16 fruit and is disease resistant. With a sugar content of 8-11%Brix, this tomato sets the standard for sweetness.
